ROB BURROW'S TIMELINE FROM DIAGNOSIS

This information is to help you answer questions from your members or the community

December 2019: Rob announces his MND diagnosis.

October 2020: Weekend of the Challenge Cup Final and transmission of Rob's story 'My Year With MND' on BBC. Fans and supporters donate £70,000 to the MND Association.

December 2020: Rob's former captain Kevin Sinfield completes 7 in 7. His show of support and friendship for Rob made headline news and helped him raise an incredible £2.6 million.

July 2021: Rob becomes a patron of the MND Association

September 2021: Rob joins the United To End MND campaign, delivering a letter to Downing Street urging the Government to invest £50m in targeted MND research.

November 2021: Kevin completes Extra Mile challenge in honour of Rob. Raises over £2 million for MND Association and Leeds Hospitals Charity

April 2022: Rob Burrow receives MBE at Windsor Castle Investiture

October 2022: The second Rob Burrow documentary 'Living with MND' is shown by the BBC

November 2022: Rob greets his former team mate Kev Sinfield at Headingley during his Ultra 7 in 7 Challenge which raises £2.3 million

May 2023: Rob completes the inaugural Rob Burrow Leeds Marathon having been pushed round the 26.2 mile course in his wheelchair by Kevin Sinfield

Jan 2024: Rob awarded a CBE in 2024 New Year's Honours list
