Thank you for taking the time to read my story. As some of you may be aware I took on the challenge of running my marathon at the inaugural Rob Burrows Leeds Marathon last year and raised money for the Motor

Neurone Disease Association (MNDA). This year I have decided to take on the half marathon distance and these are my reasons why. Last year, my mum, Barbara, as always, was there to support and cheer me on, watching from the streets of Headingley. I fortunately got to see her twice on the route and as I crossed the finishing line. I could hear her screaming and shouting above the crowds, waving a handmade banner. For those who know my mum, she exuberates life and will support her loved ones in anything they want to do. Little did we know at the time, that the MNDA charity would become close to our families' hearts. Shortly after the marathon she was referred to the Neurology department at Seacroft Hospital. Mum's health had been deteriorating for 2 years after suffering from two strokes, sadly her voice and speech were not improving and required further investigations. On the 7th of September 2023, mum was diagnosed with Motor Neurone Disease. A mere 4 weeks later, whilst on holiday with friends, playing her much-loved Bridge card game, suffered multiple strokes. She hospitalised and has never returned home. This has changed our lives forever. She now resides at a lovely care home in Adel (which happens to be on the Leeds half marathon route). The past 6 months has taught me time is precious and family and friends are the most important things in our lives. Therefore, this year, I have chosen to run the half marathon to raise money for this wonderful charity. The MNDA has already provided my

family with a lot of support during this difficult time and will continue to do so. We do not know how long we have with my determined, kind, thoughtful, amazing, and fierce mum. Therefore, I would like to raise awareness and money for this wonderful charity to support families like our own in the future. Last year I raised over £700 and I would love to exceed this. Therefore as 7 is such an integral number to this charity, my aim for the year is to raise £777 over two half marathon events – Leeds Half Marathon in May and the Great North Run in September. It hasn't been easy but it's nothing compared to the challenges that MND can throw at people which is why I may still be on maternity leave but I am asking for your help in raising much needed funds in the fight against this cruel disease.

The funds raised will be split 50:50 between my local group the Hambleton & Richmondshire Group and MND research. The support offered by local branches and groups is incredible and they are made up of so many selfless and inspiring individuals who I am lucky to know and work with.
