The post of MND family care co-ordinator has been funded by Challenging MND and we a NHS have partnered with the charity to fulfil this post.

Emma Mylam can offer extra support to families and carers, offering a listening ear, onward referrals to MNDA, Care providers, External services including counselling however the list is exhaustive depending on the need.

Emma works 8hrs on a Tuesday and Wednesday her other days are spent in her current post in the community Nursing Team. Emma has vast experience with patients and relatives, She also has a personal experience in MND losing her Mum & Aunt 8yrs ago.

We are planning some carer/family educational group sessions where we aim to talk about MND, what to expect and what services are involved in the journey and how they can support the patient & families. We aim to get guest speakers in and once we know from the first session or before what families/carers would like to know about we can include this in the sessions.

We are still in the planning stages, but we hope these groups will help and be up & running around March time. These groups will be open to all families & carers of the MND patients in the North East Essex that we cover.
