Treasurer's Report

I report on the quarter ended 31st December 2024 and also the year to that date, our financial year end.

The income for the final quarter was £16,354 which included £1.504 from the Llovds Foundation, £1,800 from the Unite band concert and £2,250 from the Royal Order of Buffaloes Doncaster. I previously reported on the October receipts. This brought our total income for the year to £95,733, a record by some margin. When I started the role of Treasurer 18 years ago, our annual income was around £20,000. We have come a long way as a branch in that time due to the fantastic team we have built and the raising of awareness.

In the early years, I generally had to tell people what MND was. That rarely happens now and the raised awareness has benefitted the branch, and consequently, those who need our help. I doubt that 2025 will be as successful, but as receipts for January were £6,261, we have made a good start.

What we spend is just as important as our income. In the final quarter of the year, we spent £20,366 on care making the total for the year £63,090, another record. In November, we paid out £15,000 to a research project being conducted at SITraN in Sheffield, where progress is being made into the causes of MND.

Research is so important and we are lucky to have such a highly regarded centre in Sheffield. We ended the year with available reserves of £8,000 to carry forward, which leaves us in a comfortable position to start 2025. Demands on our resources are ever increasing though, so we must strive to maintain our income at this higher level.

Chesterfield Royal Hospital Fund Raising on behalf of the South Yorkshire Branch

On Wednesday 22nd January Brian Jackson and Christine Naylor were invited along to Chesterfield Royal Hospital to receive a cheque for £1,800 raised by staff and community at the hospital.

The fundraising was the idea of Elaine Waddington who works at the hospital and has a friend who is living with MND. Raffles were run over the year and this very generous amount was raised to help the Branch. The staff we met were very interested in the Branch and it was a prime opportunity to raise awareness of MND and how the Branch supports the MND community in South Yorkshire. Thanks to Angela Innes, Staff Nurse at the hospital and to Elaine Waddington for their warm welcome and a huge thank you to all concerned in raising the £1,800.

Neil's 70th Birthday Fundraiser

Neil Morris, a retired Community Worker and Charity Volunteer from Barnsley, was diagnosed with MND in September 2024. He has already received support from the MNDA, who provided a laptop to enable Neil to bank his voice. The Branch wished Neil a Happy Birthday and sent a huge thank you to Janet and Neil Morris for raising £1,168, which will used in the South Yorkshire Branch to support local people living with MND.

Neil wanted to help spread the word and raise funds for the MND community in South Yorkshire. With his 70th birthday coming up in January 2025, Neil decided to have a big party, but instead of gifts, everyone at the party was invited to make a donation.

With the help of Jenn Scribbens, MNDA Regional Fundraiser, Neil set up a Just Giving page and ordered an MNDA publicity pack. The online donations soon came flooding in raising £712 + £146 Gift Aid. Readable Research at SITraN Sheffield Helping you to understand

Are you aware of this scheme? www.readableresearch.com

There is a team of people at Sheffield SITraN, Sheffield Institute for Translational Neuroscience, who work together to produce clear, simple summaries of the work in Neuroscience, and particularly Motor Neurone Disease research, hot off the press.



- •The aim is to let people know what is going on with simple summaries of the scientific papers in MND research.
- •If people understand the work going on they can be more involved.
- •They do this by partnering with a lay panel made up of the public who provide feedback on the summaries.
- •Anyone who has been affected by Motor Neurone **Disease** can help by providing feedback on the summaries before they are published to make them as 'readable' as possible.

This team recently produced a lay summary from an important study "Exploring a new drug to protect motor neurons and treat ALS/MND". It's scientific title is Neuroprotective effects of Elloraxine in neuronal model of degeneration. There is a link to the full study published last year on the Readable Research RR site.

The team felt this was an important study to look at because "we may be able to slow the progression of ALS with the potential neuroprotective effects of a new drug called Elloraxine, a synthetic version of vitamin A."

They explain what the authors of the study did, how they went about it and what the results were. Finally, whilst acknowledging that such research was still in the early stages, they explain what the findings mean going forward for people with MND.

They would like to **recruit** more MND panel members to the scheme. You can do this from home. It normally consists of 1-2, two-page summaries every month and you'll be given specific guidance on the type of feedback that they need.
