A SAD GOODBYE TO MICHELLE



In May, we sadly said farewell to Michelle Malouf, on the right, our wonderful Community Support Cofor ordinator. Michelle worked the **MND** Association, specifically the West Yorkshire Branch, for five years. She joined us in lockdown having worked in the MND field for five years in Australia. During this time, the West Yorkshire Branch has grown, not only with the number of people living with MND, but in terms of the number of volunteers Michelle has recruited. We now have 10 Association Visitors covering our region, whereas there was only one when she came into post. We have more fundraising volunteers, a Campaigns Team and volunteers who look after our social media output. Michelle made it her mission to get to know every person living with MND and their carers in our patch. She supported the Current Carers Group and set up The Cornflower Group for recently bereaved Carers, both of which meet monthly. She encouraged the MND Care Co-ordinators and MND Clinical Nurse Specialists in West Yorkshire to communicate with each other, linking them together by organising regular meetings. And, of course, she got us through the 'Rob Burrow Years'. Being at Headingley Stadium pretty much the full week following his death to offer comfort and support to those of us who were somewhat overwhelmed by the outpouring of grief. Contending with guestions from the media and getting them the answers, all the while organising an extra Support Get Together that week, so there was a safe space to come and grieve. The Branch will miss her terribly, I will miss her, she's always had my back! We wish Michelle all the best in her future, whatever path she takes.

£££££££££££££ HOW ARE THE FUNDS YOU RAISE SPENT?

Last year (2024) the West Yorkshire branch funded or part funded £89,727 in Care Grants, Quality of Life Grants, Carers and Young Carers Grants & Children & Young Persons Grants.

These grants included funding for lightweight wheelchairs, wheelchair accessories, specialist chairs, wet room adaptations, WAV hire, mobility scooters, stairlift rental, holidays and break aways, items of technology, TVs, transport costs (to appointments), neater straws and much more.

All this could not have been achieved without the wonderful work of all the dedicated fundraisers in West Yorkshire.

Grants are divided into different categories as follows:-

The MND Support Grant (Care), up to a maximum of £1,500 per application, is offered to anyone living with MND; the application must be completed by a gualified Health or Social Care professional.

The Quality of Life Grant, up to a maximum of £500 per application, is there to support both the person with MND and their family.

The Carers and Young Carers Grant, up to a maximum of £500 per application, supports the main Carer for someone with MND to allow them to take a break from caring duties and/or promote the well-being of the carer or young carer.

The Children &Young Person's Grant, up to a maximum of £250 per person, is for those aged 18 or under residing with a person living with MND or having a parent or guardian with MND. It could help towards hobbies, school trips, technology, or even driving lessons.
