TREASURERS REPORT



Wow! What a super summer of social and fundraising events we have had, from picnics at Aylesford Priory and Leeds Castle, to marathon and half runs. cricket marathon matches. summer fayres, cake sales, and coffee mornings. Thank you to everyone for joining us at these events, for your support and awareness raising for MND; we hope you enjoyed them and are looking forward to the next events we have planned, Walk to D'feet, Xmas Bazaar and the Xmas Afternoon tea.

We have received some generous donations over the last few months including another legacy sum of over £8000, a grant of £6000 from the Kent Community Foundation and £250 from Chatham Rotary. We were successful

in receiving the maximum sum of £1500 from the Tesco Blue Token scheme (Lunsford Park Store) and thank everyone who popped their blue token in the box to support us. We are the chosen charity for the Inner Wheel of Gillingham and after a talk given by Sheila they presented us with a cheque for £1200! Our branch and 3rd party fundraising events have all been incredibly well supported and have helped us to raise over £5000. We thank all the committee members for their hard work; a special thank you to Sue who runs our successful 100 club. standing order subscriptions this year so far are £1400! Our overall income so far this year is a fantastic sum £38541! Our thanks go to :- Kent Community Foundation, Chatham Rotary Club, Tesco Groundworks, General Gordon Masonic Lodge, Easyfundraising, The Cavendish Café. Dan Coward. Leybourne convenience store, BC, Medway Time Lottery, Savers Bearsted, Jen Sanders, Abbe Hall, Gravesend Cricket Club, S&Y Clark, J&J Perin, M Caverley. We also thank our committee members for plant, book sales, currency exchange, 100 club and quiz sheets and of course to everyone for your support and general donations. Special thanks to those who donate regularly via standing order and thanks also go to everyone who Easyfundraising and who gift aid their donations.

Over the last few months, we have spent £34650 to support people affected by MND. Our care costs have included quality of life grants, carers grants and therapies for people with MND and their carers. We have made contributions towards the installations and rental of stairlifts, removal of bio bidets, installations of ramp kits, repairs to scooters, wet room adaptations and covered the costs of deliveries and collections. We continue to cover the costs of the MND support days at both the Heart of Kent Hospice and Wisdom Hospice. We have spent a total of £59000 on care so far this year, with a large portion of this coming from our

restricted funds to support people with quality of life, carer's and young people's grants, this is more than we spent on care in the whole of 2024. We are committed to supporting people affected by MND.

Thank you to everyone who has continued to support us with your online donations via our justgiving and tribute pages, by standing orders or bank transfers direct to our account.

Please get in touch if you wish to gift aid any donations that are made directly to our account, we receive an extra 25p for every £1 donated via gift aid which really does make a difference to our funds. As always we commit to using every penny raised or donated, to support others diagnosed with MND so no one feels alone. Your donations will help us to continue to provide support to people with MND. 
If you and your partner, spouse or friend would like to join us, please tell me by Friday November 17th - so that the caterers know how many bowls of dry bread and water to prepare!

Motor Neurone Disease (MND) is the name given to a group of related, but widely varying, diseases affecting the motor neurones in the brain and spinal cord. Motor neurones are the nerve cells that control muscles; hence their degeneration causes weakness and muscle wasting.

MND is usually regarded as progressive but the rate of progression varies greatly from person to person and between the three main types of disease. In the UK it is believed that there are about 6,000 people suffering from MND at any one time.
