As usual, November and December were relatively quiet months, with income totalling £7,176. Particular thanks go to Doncaster Knights and the Woodhouse Band for boosting our income. In those months, we gave a lot of support to those living with MND, with care grants totalling £11,555. In respect of the year to 31st December 2025, receipts totalled £83,214, less than the total for 2024 which was £95,733, but as there were 2 very large donations in 2024 which have not reoccurred, I regard 2025 as a very successful year, and to

Go Kev Go!

Thursday 4th December saw the visit of Kevin Sinfield and his entourage to Sheffield, the City of Steel, as part of his 7x7 latest marathon. What a day to undertake the hills of our city. The weather was dismal, grey and wet but this did not deter Kevin as he pounded the streets with his usual effortless running. He did, however, acknowledge that the fourth day of this leg of the marathon had been the toughest yet. People turned out to cheer him on despite the dull December day and the cars honked their horns in support as he ran past. At every stop he called at Kevin took time out to address the crowd and to spend some moments chatting to the people living with MND who were present. What a memorable moment that must have been. At Sheffield Tigers, our chairman vigorously banged the drum; on Herries Road, the teachers and children from the nearby school cheered him on as he climbed the hill. One of the children asked if he was a Pop Star, but those of us there assured her that he was more than that as Kevin took a few minutes to go down the line and

Speak with the children. We got a brief opportunity to explain to some of the children about MND. At Don Valley our Branch Contact, Ann Quinn, amongst others, ran the last mile with him. It was a privilege, despite getting soaked to the skin, to witness Kevin's determination to raise awareness and money to find a cure for MND and you get the feeling that he does not intend to give up until a cure is on the horizon. On completion of the marathon, £14,000 had been raised for several MND charities. Thank you Kevin, a Man of Steel, who the City of Steel were proud to welcome.



Hug from a Hero

Martin Kelly was delighted when he heard that Kevin Sinfeld would be running through Sheffield on day four of his 7in7 challenge last December. Even better, that his route would be quite close to home and finishing at Sheffield Institute for Translational Neuroscience SITraN. Living with MND, Martin had taken a lot of interest in research, assisted researchers and cooperated in a number of trials at the institute. Also an active fundraiser himself, Martin

greatly admired Kevin and his efforts in memory of his friend and for raising awareness of the disease.

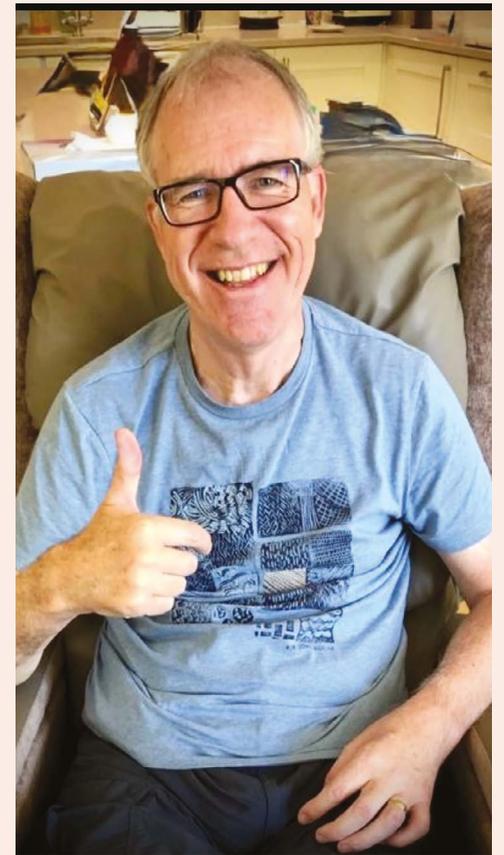
His wife, Carol, asked us what the possibility would be of Martin meeting Kevin on the day. Stacey Kirkpatrick, our Regional Relationship Fundraiser, couldn't make any promises, but it was arranged for Martin to come to SITraN and they would certainly do their best to make it happen. Sadly, three days



before the Sheffield challenge, Martin passed away. Carol and daughters Jenny and Becky were heartbroken, but felt that Martin would still have wanted them to show up to support Kevin. On the day they came along to the third stage stop at Sheffield Tigers rugby ground and waited in the pouring rain to cheer Kevin into the ground along with Jessica Ennis-Hill and Jenn Scribbins. Jenn Scribbins was the Regional Fundraiser attending this stage and she was determined that Kevin should hear Carol's story.

The drum had already been banged and Kevin was poised to start the next leg of his run, when Jenn pushed forwards and very briefly managed to tell Kevin what had happened. He gave Carol a hug and said how very sorry he was before tapping his watch and was off. Carol said afterwards that she knew these runs were timed to the last second and it had meant so much to her that he had taken the time just to give her the hug and to know he cared.

The BBC Breakfast reporter covering the challenge heard the conversation and asked the family if they would share their story. Soaking wet and



unprepared, Carol, Becky and Jenny spoke passionately to the reporter about Martin, his journey with MND and the fantastic fundraising his friends and family had undertaken since his diagnosis. The story featured next morning on BBC Breakfast and accompanied by lovely photos of Martin it became a fitting tribute to two heroes and a worthy reward for the work undertaken to achieve Martin's plan.

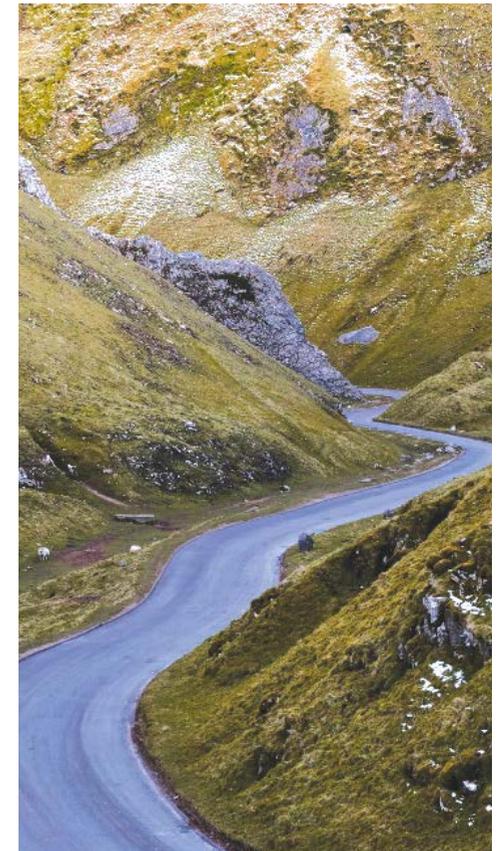
April saw me cycling to London. June was the turn of Cardiff whilst in July I was off to Edinburgh. The culmination of the year was Dublin and Belfast in September.

AI and Behaviour Changes in MND 2025

In December, the MND association held its 36th International Symposium in San Diego, this is the largest annual conference dedicated to MND and ALS research. Over three days lots of interesting research and new understandings are shared amongst 1000+ delegates.

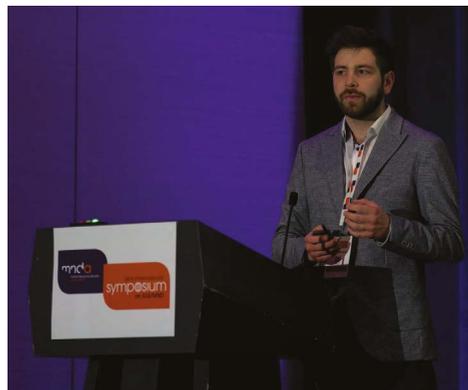
Various talks included new information surrounding AI, which is a new and ever-growing tool. One session, led by Marcel Weinreich, talked about a new AI feature that helps doctors anticipate when patients may need a feeding tube. The tool combines health information such as weight changes to make individual predictions. This tool has been tested in several countries and so far, has been proven to be accurate and reliable. Going forward this could benefit doctors and people diagnosed with MND to plan treatment in advance, hopefully improving comfort and care.

A topic also discussed at the International Symposium was how behaviour and thinking can change with MND. Professor Sharon Abrahams started off the discussion and explained how approximately half of people

diagnosed with MND experience changes in their behaviour and way of thinking. Prof Abrahams explained why it was important to test for these changes, and how the Edinburgh Cognitive and Behavioural ALS screen may be able to predict when there is a build up of TDP-43 (which is a protein that forms abnormal clumps in the brains of people with MND) in parts of the brain that effect thinking and behaviour.

Readable Research volunteers needed!

Are you interested in research surrounding MND and want to help make it more accessible?

Readable research are looking for volunteers who have approximately 60 minutes spare a month. You will be asked to give feedback on a word document, usually two pages, summarising a recent MND or dementia paper.

The goal of this process is to make information understandable, and it is important to have volunteers to review these papers before they go online, so information can be refined. Backgrounds in science are not needed for this task, just enthusiasm to help make research simple!

Any feedback about making the paper easy to understand is appreciated, your comments will typically answer these questions:

1. Does the lay summary make sense?
2. Is the language appropriate, or too complicated? Is there unnecessary jargon?
3. Do you understand what the findings of the paper mean for people with MND/ Dementia?
4. Is it clear how you can access the paper?
5. What have we done well?
6. How can we improve?

Support for Carers

“I think that sometimes people take on a caring role, but don't realise they are carers and don't get the help that is available to them.”

If your relative or friend has been diagnosed with MND, supporting them may feel part of your relationship. However, health and social care services describe someone who provides unpaid care support as a 'carer'. This term can help you identify support for carers.

- The South Yorkshire branch can offer support to carers through their Association Visitors: contact **jayne.thompson@mndassociation.org**
- The branch also offers help in the form of Financial Support Funds. If you are the main unpaid carer aged 16 or over, caring for someone with MND, the Association may be able to offer you some financial assistance within a rolling twelve month period. The aim of this support fund is to allow the main non-paid carer to take a break from their caring duties. This may be a pamper day, a short break or assistance towards pursuing a hobby and can be applied for up to 18 months post bereavement. It is not

means tested, does not need to be repaid and funds are not considered as income by the DWP. Contact Brian Jackson **brian.jackson@mndassociation.org**
